SUBJECT: Open Government Directive

In the Memorandum on Transparency and Open Government, issued on January 21, 2009, the President instructed the Director of the Office of Management and Budget (OMB) to issue an Open Government Directive. Responding to that instruction, this memorandum is intended to direct executive departments and agencies to take specific actions to implement the principles of transparency, participation, and collaboration set forth in the President's Memorandum. This Directive was informed by recommendations from the Federal Chief Technology Officer, who solicited public comment through the White House Open Government Initiative.

Knowledge Management in Journalism

Knowledge Management: practices in coding, storing, sharing, transmitting and leveraging knowledge assets within and between organizations

1. inward-facing approach (databases organize information gathered through reporters' own investigations)
2. outward-facing approach (databases that manage larger flow of data generated by other actors in the open data ecosystem)

Data Liberation, Preservation & Archiving

Pooling Resources and Expertise - Share technical skills, navigate more effectively local laws, languages, and cultural norms. Methods include web scraping, FOIA requests, offline sources, and a network of coordinators.


- ✓ e.g. **Environmental Data Projects**: Journalists in countries with strong FOI laws can obtain pollution data and share it with colleagues in countries where such data is hidden.
- ✓ e.g. **ARIJ Archival Initiatives** - ARIJ has been collecting and archiving datasets since 2009 from 18 Arab countries, transfer their archives to the OCCPR Aleph Global database

Open Data Repositories

ADVOCATING FOR TRANSPARENCY

e.g. **openAfrica** by *Code for Africa*; **Offshore Leaks Database** by *International Consortium of Investigative Journalists (ICIJ)*

- ✓ broad civic open data repositories oriented towards transparency and public use
- ✓ Built as a data warehouses & data preservation
- ✓ Designed for public accessibility and usability
- ✓ Designed as knowledge repository & retrieval system




Data Standardization

HARMONIZING DATA ACROSS JURISDICTIONS

E.g. **Aleph** by *Organized Crime and Corruption Reporting Project (OCCRP)*; **ARIJ Aleph** by *Arab Reporters for Investigative Journalism*

- ✓ investigative-first platforms tailored to journalists
- ✓ Partially open to external actors
- ✓ Designed as a search, discovery, and verification engine for large datasets
- ✓ Data standardization aligns government records, corporate registries, procurement data, and court documents from various jurisdictions.



Data Connectors

e.g. **NINA** by *Latin American Center for Investigative Journalism (CLIP)*

- ✓ a decentralized data commons that connects public and private databases from more than 21 countries, enabling users to search and cross-reference datasets in a single unified interface
- ✓ Rather than storing documents and other information, NINA's architecture aggregates and harmonizes heterogeneous data sources
- ✓ translates diverse API languages and structures into a unified schema that allows seamless querying and analysis across multiple national systems



DATA ECOSYSTEMS FOR REGIONAL AUTONOMY

South-South networks promote knowledge exchange and co-development of tools tailored to local needs. Collaborating within these contexts fosters mutual understanding, shared strategies, and resilience.

- ✓ e.g. NINA by CLIP works with structured and unstructured data, connecting to various databases focusing on public information data from Latin America. Mini NINAs (Guatemala, Honduras, El Salvador), specific versions of NINA catering to specific needs of those countries

Reframing Journalism's Professional Identity

Knowledge Management Systems – a novel practice of epistemic culture

▪ *from reporting events → to co-producing civic data*

- ✓ Cross-border collaboration hubs in journalism have become both producers and custodians of open data infrastructures, blurring the line between news production and knowledge brokers

Open-Source Culture & Data Activism

▪ *from objectivity → to civic accountability practice*

- ✓ cross-border journalism infrastructures straddle the line between professional investigative tools and civic data commons
- ✓ by creating shared databases and advocating for open government, journalists contribute to broader transparency and open-source data ecosystems.
- ✓ journalist frames data activism through the lens of information disclosure, watchdog roles, and public accountability – “creating open datasets for social good”




OIDA Addresses Many Important Questions

1. How have **pharmaceutical companies** driven the current opioid epidemic?
2. What was **known within these companies, at what time, by whom**, regarding potential risks of addiction and overdose?
3. How have **marketing and promotional practices deviated** from FDA standards?
4. How have **intermediary organizations, such as advocacy organizations**, been used by the industry to promote messaging that misconstrues the risks and benefits of opioids?
5. What role have **other stakeholders (e.g., wholesalers, pharmacies)** played in driving opioid oversupply?

OIDA Toolbox for computational research methods

- **Social network analysis:** Which employees within a company communicated with each other most frequently, and during which time periods? What does this social network tell us about how communication and decision-making work in a large organization?
- **Sentiment analysis:** Did employees in certain roles use language (euphemisms, tone, commands, etc.) in certain ways, or did it change over time? What does this tell us about how language is used in the modern workplace and in relation to specific steps in the wrongdoing of these companies?
- Other forms of **text mining:**
 - At what point were key decisions made, and by whom? How did these patterns differ from one company to another?
 - After manually locating a few instances of deception or misconstrual of evidence in the OIDA corpus, can we detect more instances automatically using machine-learning models?

AI at OIDA

AI metadata project – Why AI?

- Almost 7M documents in OIDA
 - ~115k "triple-blanks"
 - Increasing volume of under-described metadata at receipt
- Metadata is a critical access point
- Challenges with AI



OIDA Image Collection

Highlights images extracted primarily from presentations—many for internal company audiences and board members, others targeted to prescribers.

The story of how industry has created markets for their drugs, then promoted them using established playbooks, is brought to life in these images.

6000+ images extracted from documents at launch, more documents, more images coming online.

Metadata for each image: title, description, type, category, OCR text, keywords, drug, topic



Image Classification

- Category assigned by zero-shot CLIP model from OpenAI
- Images sorted into six classes:
 - advertisement
 - photograph
 - table
 - Illustration
 - graph or chart
 - map
- ~58% agreement w/ expert annotator




